As I write this month's newsletter article, I am told that today (March 20th) is the first day of spring. This is somewhat confusing for me as I look outside and see piles of snow and no blooming

trees and flowers. Not to mention that the weather forecast is predicting snow later this week. Something or someone must be wrong. Either way, things aren't as they appear to be. Am I to believe that spring is here, although my eyes tell me it is still winter? We Christians often have this same problem with our standing in Christ. Paul writes to the people of Corinth, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." 2 Cor 5:17 Paul's words tell us that when we stand covered in the blood of Christ, that is when

we confess that Christ is our Lord, we

are no longer the person we were before. That old person, filled with mistakes, regret, and brokenness, has passed away. At that very moment in time when we stand in the grace of Jesus Christ, we are a brandnew creation!

Funny, when I look in the mirror, I don't see a brandnew creation. I see that same old person, not only filled with mistakes and regret but wearing the results of many of those mistakes on my outside. Where is this new person that Paul talks about? And since I cannot see this new person, is it real? Much like my discovery of the first day of spring while my eyes tell me that it is still winter outside, we are often deceived by our eyes. The reason that happens is that we are looking at ourselves and others as the world sees us. The

world tells us to be "new" means to have

everything that we desire, to be perfect in body and mind, and to be the most attractive version of ourselves. Yet when God sees us, he sees His child made perfect again. God doesn't look at us with the evaluation that the world uses. He isn't measuring us up to one another, as if life was some big competition. No, God sees each person individually, made perfect by Christ, yet loved as they are. No longer are we the old version of ourselves, lost and seeking the approval of the world and worrying because we can never quite measure up. No. This is true, you are made new in Christ!

Look at yourself as God sees you! Then,

when you look upon me, please see me as the loved child of God, the same as yourself, and not the result of many misguided steps. Hopefully, we can share this view with others and see them as the brand-new creation that they are as well. Unlike the weatherman, God's Word is always right!


