This representative recommended we service the AED and fire extinguisher. Finally, this representative recommended background checks on all individuals that would be "in charge of" youth activities. Andy will be meeting with our insurance agent next week and our insurance deductible may be increasing from \$2,500/yr to \$5,000/yr.

Secretary's Report: No addition or corrections


New Business:


