

INCLEMENT WEATHER & CANCELLATIONS


Re: Church activities and office hours. If Springfield schools are canceled or dismissed early all activities and the church office will be



12TH ANNUAL THREE DAYS OF PRAYER

Prayer was a holy habit practiced by Jesus Himself (see Mark 1:35; Luke 11:1). The disciples who walked alongside Him witnessed a connection between His public life and ministry, and this habit of prayer. It was a connection so significant, that they asked Jesus to teach them to pray (Luke 11:1).

LCMC's Three Days of Prayer on January 2-4 is an opportunity for us to follow the Lord's example and to come together as one across the association with a shared purpose: to pray.

Each congregation or person can structure these days of prayer however seems best. In the past, some congregations put together a prayer vigil – a person signing up to pray in 30-minute intervals – perhaps for all three days or a few hours each day. Others have offered a prayer service at a set hour on each of

the three days. Some have encouraged their people simply to pray at work, home, or school, wherever they are and whatever they are doing. During this time of a continued experience of COVID-19 throughout the country and overseas, we encourage you to do whatever works best and whatever is safest for your congregation.

No matter how you structure this time of prayer, let's come together as an association of congregations across the U.S. and around the world to pray.
